



## Did you know...

A honey bee visits two million flowers to make one pound of honey.

A honey bee flies about 15 miles per hour.

An average worker bee makes 1/12 of a teaspoon of honey in her lifetime.

A honey bee visits 50-100 flowers during one collection trip and can be up to 2 miles from the hive.

A beekeeper can take between 50-100 lbs. of honey from one strong colony.

Honey bees produce more than honey. They also make propolis, wax and royal jelly.

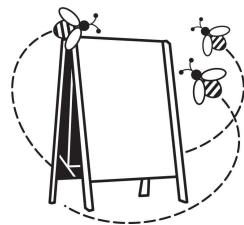

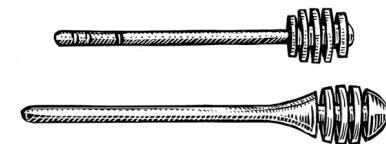
