



Did you know...

- * Honey bees will visit two million flowers to collect the nectar for one pound of honey.
- * Bees only sting to protect the colony, queen, or themselves. After a bee stings, she dies!
- * Bees pollinate 70% of all fruit, vegetable and seed crops used for food and grown here.
- * To make a 1/12 teaspoon of honey, a bee will spend an entire lifetime collecting nectar.
- * It is not unusual for a beekeeper to harvest 50-100 lbs of honey from one strong colony.
- * A strong queen is able to lay more than 1500 eggs each day.
- * In addition to honey, bees also produce propolis, royal jelly, bee's wax and pollen.
- * Bees can't see the color red.

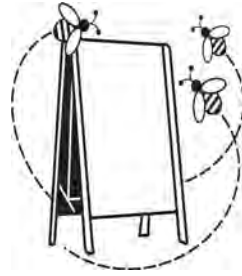

A 1/2 hour before Bee School starts we generally show a beekeeping video or have demonstrations that relate to beekeeping.

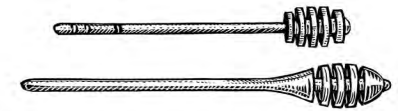
The course costs only \$60 and includes books on beekeeping and on bee diseases. Also included is your 2012 membership in PBA and our monthly newsletter.

Directions : 101 E or W take exit 3 toward Candia. Merge onto NH 43 N. At stop light turn left onto Rte. 27 W heading toward Hooksett. At the top of the hill left onto South Rd. Lodge is 300' on the left. From Northwd/Deerfield, Rte. 43 S to intersection with Rte. 27. Turn right then, as above. From Raymond stay on 27 to stoplight as above.
